

Prosper Eagles Swim & Dive Kick Off 2019-20 Season at Frisco ISD Sprint Invitational



Join us on October 15th when the Swim and Dive Team hosts Plano Senior High in our first ever Home Meet at the PISD Natatorium!

On September 26th and 28th, 2019 numerous teams from around the metroplex, came together for the Frisco ISD Invitational at the Bruce Eubanks Natatorium in Frisco, TX. The meet provided a great opportunity for PHS swimmers and divers to put their training to the test. Reflecting on the meet, Coach Sarah Milne, in her 4th year as head coach, shared that she was impressed by team's spirit and unity. "From the new team cheer being one of the loudest on deck to seeing JV swimmers come out to support their varsity teammates, it was awesome to see a united team cheering each other on." And there was plenty for PHS to cheer about. Both the men's and women's teams claimed 2nd place overall, scoring 353 and 292 points respectively.

The Dive team opened the meet on Thursday, 9/26 and Freshmen diver, Ryan Dimmick, who started diving just 3 months ago, put together a strong set of dives for his first competition and finished first overall! For the women, returning diver Haley Fein earned a 6th place finish while teammates Kalee Morgan, Myka Sullivan, and Shawwna Caliva took the 8th, 10th, and 11th spots respectively. In addition, three rookie divers, Shaelyn Haiman (7th place), Emily Rothacker (12th place) and Emma Savage (14th place) all made strong showings. Our coaches are excited to see the Dive Team's development over the season.

On Saturday, 9/28, both the varsity men's and women's teams put in a strong showing. Swimmers Ethan Hogan, Mithuun Ramesh, Kadence Griffin and Justice Hunt kicked off competition with a win in the 100 Medley Relay. A little later, Hannah Schulze, Keira Kleposki, Morgan Frazier, and Heather Pappas posted a 4th place finish in the 100 Free Relay. And to close the meet, Kadence Griffin, Mithuun Ramesh, Ethan Hogan and Justice Hunt combined once again to place 4th in the 200 Free Relay. While still a fairly young team, there is a lot of depth on the roster and fans can expect the relays to get even stronger as the season progresses.

When it came to individual events, PHS had a number of top three finishes. Junior Caroline Egger captured a 3rd place finish in the 25 Free, while freshman Maddie Lesko claimed 3rd place in the 50 Fly and junior Jocelyn Hayes took 3rd in the 50 Breast. Well done ladies. For the men, junior Saxon Boring had an impressive win in the 50 Breast. Sophomore Lane White, a talented freestyler, finished 2nd in the 50 Free and 3rd in the 25 Free. Junior Mithuun Ramesh took 2nd place in the 100 IM and 3rd in the 50 Breaststroke. Meanwhile, in the 50 Back, sophomore Ethan Hogan put up a 3rd place finish. Finally, Justice Hunt, a junior, finished 2nd in both the 200 Free and the 25 Free events.

On October 9th, the Prosper Swim and Dive teams continue their season at the Tom Muehlenbeck Natatorium In Plano, Texas where they will put their talent to the test against Plano West in their first dual-meet of the season.
